Attendance

Wake County Board Policy 6000.8

- At the secondary level cumulative absences above ten (10) in a block course (twenty (20) in a full-year course) are excessive. After five (5) days of accumulated absences in one or more block courses, (ten (10) in a full-year course) there will be schooldetermined, expectations-based intervention to help the student improve his or her attendance. The intervention will involve parents. After ten (10) days of accumulated absences in a block course (twenty (20) in a full-year course) and failure to meet previously-determined expectations, the student will be subject to failure, retention, or summer school.
- 2 absences in a block scheduled class is like missing 4 days of learning!

DWFHS (Driving while Failing High School) Policy

Students must pass 70% of courses (3 out of 4 on a block schedule) to be able to obtain or maintain their drivers license!

What is a Block Schedule?

Waivers are required at Apex Friendship, Enloe, and Southeast Raleigh when selecting a course other than the course recommended by teacher if you are waiving up a level.

Registration Worksheet

- All students will complete a worksheet for their assigned school <u>and</u> transfer school, if applicable.
- Students will use the worksheet for their assigned school to complete the online registration process.
- Students may not register online for transfer schools and will turn in handwritten and signed worksheet by deadline.
- Online registration is not available for the Early College high schools. Students will be contacted by their respective school.





March 1 & 2 – Counselor in classes.

March 1-6 – Students register online and complete graduation plans at home.

March 7 & 8 – Students register online in the media center if unable to register at home

March 18 – <u>**Deadline</u></u> for turning in Graduation Plans, Registration Worksheet(s) and online Course Verification forms signed by parent. Students must have completed the registration process online at home or in the media center.</u>**

Registration: What's Due and When

Staple together the following information:

- 1. <u>Completed and Signed</u> Graduation Plan or CFNC plan.
- 2. <u>Completed and Signed</u> Registration worksheet for assigned school and/or any transfer school.
- **3.** <u>Completed and Signed</u> Course Verification Form (Homebase/Powerschools) if completed on-line at home.
- 4. <u>Waivers</u> (if applicable) Apex Friendship, Enloe and Southeast Raleigh only.
- 5. <u>Due Date</u> All registrations must be completed by March 18. This allows one week to ensure all is in order before the county deadline of **March 24**.
