## Standard, Honors, and AP Classes

Every school offers all three, but some schools may offer different course choices

| Letter Grade | Standard Courses | Honors Courses | AP Courses |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| A | 4.0 | 4.5 | 5.0 |
| B | 3.0 | 3.5 | 4.0 |
| C | 2.0 | 2.5 | 3.0 |
| D | 1.0 | 1.5 | 2.0 |
| F | 0 | 0 | 0 |



## Honors Level Classes What does it take?



## AP Level Classes

MORE rigorous than honors
Students take an AP exam and potentially receive college credit for that course Shows colleges/universities that students can handle the college level work
*Don't take honors or AP because someone you know did it....know YOUR strengths!
*Challenge yourself, but also balance yourself and your schedule


## How to calculate a GPA

Grade point average is made of quality points divided by credits: 31 QP / 8 courses $=\mathbf{3 . 8 7 5}$

| Example:11th grader Joe |  |  |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| Course | Grade | Quality Points |
| AP English III | B | 4.0 |
| Honors Math 3 | A | 4.5 |
| Honors Chemistry | B | 3.5 |
| American History II | A | 4.0 |
| French I | A | 4.0 |
| French II | B | 3.0 |
| Chorus | A | 4.0 |
| Photography | A | 4.0 |
| 8 Attempted Credits |  | Total:31 |

## Calculate This:

ELA: $\mathbf{C}$ how many quality points?
2
Math: A how many quality points?
4
AP World History: C how many quality points?
3
Honors Science: $\mathbf{B}$ how many quality points?

We add up the quality points and then divide by the number of credits (classes) which is $\mathbf{4}$. That is the GPA
12.5 quality points divided by $\mathbf{4}$ credits is a $\qquad$ GPA?

9th graders can be the lowest priority for electives, so choose alternates wisely!
