



What do classes look like in high school?

- Block Schedule: Students take 4 courses/credits each semester (Fall/Spring)
- Each course is 90 minutes
- An ENTIRE YEAR'S worth of curriculum is compressed into one semester
- Grades start to accumulate from day 1! Your GPA starts with first semester of high school. What you do semester 1 of grade year counts!


Standard, Honors, and AP Classes

AP Level Classes


MORE rigorous than honors

Students take an AP exam and potentially receive college credit for that course

Shows colleges/universities that students can handle the **college level** work

*Don't take honors or AP because someone you know did it....know YOUR strengths!

*Challenge yourself, but also balance yourself and your schedule




How to calculate a GPA

Grade point average is made of quality points divided by credits: 31 QP / 8 courses = 3.875

Calculate This:

ELA: **C** how many quality points? 2 Math: A how many quality points? 4 AP World History: **C** how many quality points? 3 Honors Science: **B** how many quality points? 3.5 We add up the quality points and then divide by the number of credits (classes) which is 4. That is the GPA **12.5** quality points divided by **4** credits is a _____ GPA? 3.125




