- November Scholarship Newsletter: To access the November Scholarship Newsletter, go to the Green Hope homepage and select Student Services under Students. Once you are on the Student Services homepage, you will select Resources, and the scholarship newsletter is located on that page. This newsletter is a great way to learn about various local and national scholarship opportunities.
- <u>College Week:</u> Green Hope High School will participate in the statewide College Application Week co-sponsored by College Foundation of North Carolina (CFNC) and the Carolinas Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (CACRAO) during November 14th-18th. Green Hope High School Student Services will work with its seniors on Tuesday, November 15 through Thursday, November 17th during 1st period, 2nd period or 4th period to complete and submit online at least one college application each using CFNC.org. To participate, seniors must come to Student Services to reserve a time and will receive a pass to show their teacher to be excused. During this event, students may apply to any of North Carolina's 58 community colleges, 36 independent colleges, and 16 state universities in which they are interested and 28 participating colleges and universities are waiving their fee for their applications. <u>Credit by Demonstrated Mastery (CDM)</u>: The Credit by Demonstrated Mastery (CDM) registration window is from November 14th to December 14th. CDM allows students to earn credit for specified courses by testing out of a course if they have already mastered the content. Wake County High School Academics and Counseling and Student Services will facilitate an information session on November 15th at Panther Creek High School from 6-7:30. <u>Sophomore and Freshmen Conferences:</u> Student Services will be conducting our Sophomore Class Conferences during November 15th -18th in English II classes and Freshman Class

Conferences during November 29th- December 1st in English I classes. These programs will also take place for sophomores and freshman in the spring in their English classes. Students will learn more about graduation requirements, high school planning, post-secondary resources and opportunities and get to know the Student Services team.
